Take a look at war art and create your own picture.

 Jodrell Bank opened in 1945, take a look at the stars and create your own constellation using a method of your choice.

Create your own poster to advertise your VE Day celebrations.

A national holiday was declared on 8th May 1945 and red, white and blue bunting could be bought without ration coupons. Make your own bunting and use lots at your VE Day celebrations.

Here's an idea! Why not put a 'Make Do and Mend' twist on your bunting by using recycled fabrics or old clothes?

Celebratory items were created in haste for the VE Day celebrations of 1945, including VE Day mugs. Decorate your own mug.

Make your own Union Jack flags for your street party.

Food

 On 7th May 1945 General Eisenhower accepted the surrender of the German forces in Reims, France. Try some French cheese, bread or other foods.

 Corned beef hash, homity pie and Lord Woolton pie were all common dishes during WWII when rationing was enforced. Find some recipes and try them for yourself.

 During WWII 20 million people died as a result of malnutrition, compared with the 19.5 million who died in combat. Find out about healthy eating and make a balanced meal/packed lunch.


Find out about some other foods that would have been popular in WWII and served at VE Day street parties up and down the country.
