Scout Badges: Moving-On Award – Cub Scout Pack to Scout Troop



The Moving-On Award is intended to help a Cub Scout make a smooth transfer to the Scout Troop. The requirements:

- Attend both Cub Scouts and Scouts for four to six weeks and take an active part in the Troop programme.
- Work for the Scout Membership Award during this time.

When is the award presented?

• The Cub Scout Leader presents the Moving-On Award, normally at a going up ceremony. If the Cub has completed the requirements for the Scout Membership Award, the Scout Leader will then invest them as a Scout and present this badge.

Where the badge should be worn?

A Scout wears the Award on the left breast above the Membership Badge and below the Joining In Award. This badge
can be worn on the Member's new Scout uniform.

Being a Scout

The Scout Section is for young people, usually aged between 10½ and 14 years. A young person can come in to the Troop at 10 and may stay until the end of the term in which they become 14½ years old. The Scout Troop is the third and final Section in the Scout Group. Scouts are encouraged to take part in a wide range of activities as part of their programme. "Participation" rather than meeting set standards is the key approach and for the Scout who wants to be recognised for his or her achievements there are a number of Challenges Awards and Activity Badges. Scouts take part in a balanced programme that helps them to find out about the world in which they live, encourages them to know their own abilities and the importance of keeping fit and helps develop their creative talents. It also provides opportunities to explore their own values and personal attitudes.
